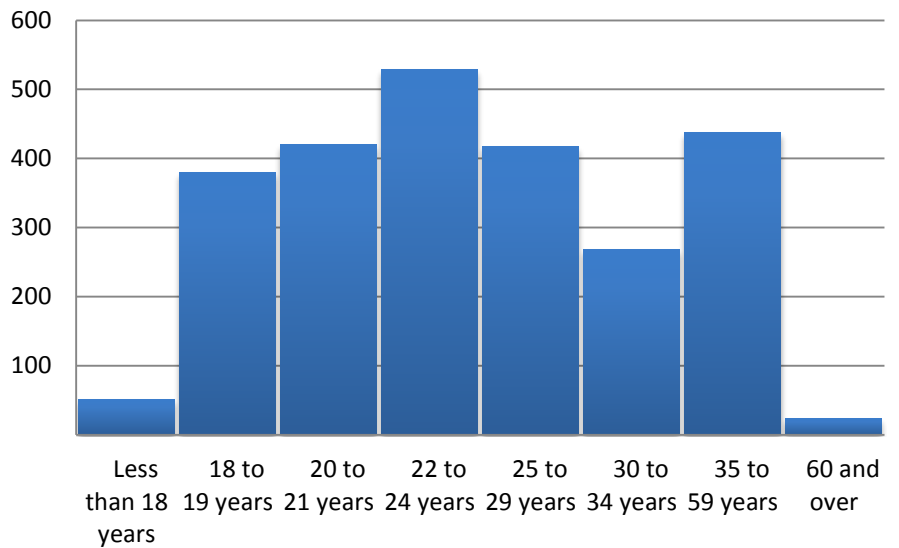

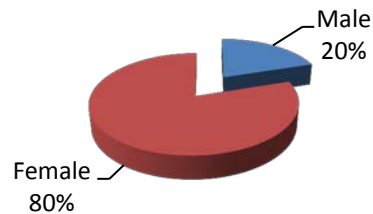

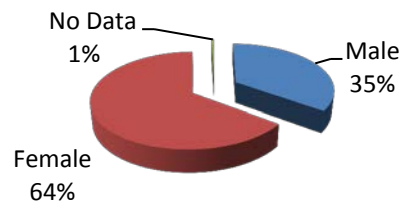

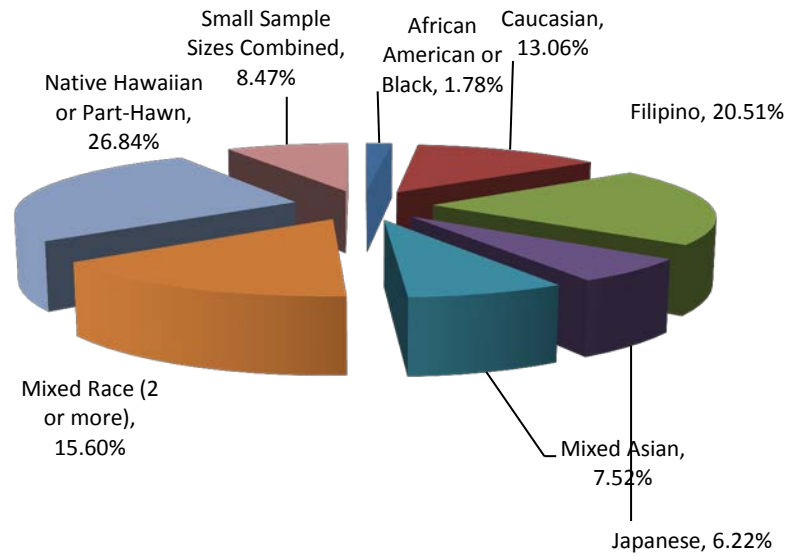

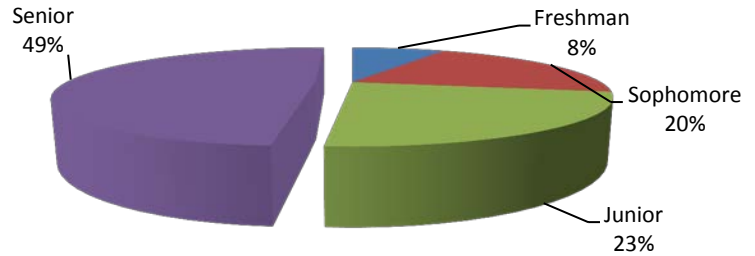

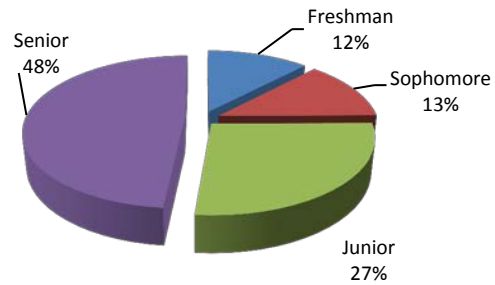

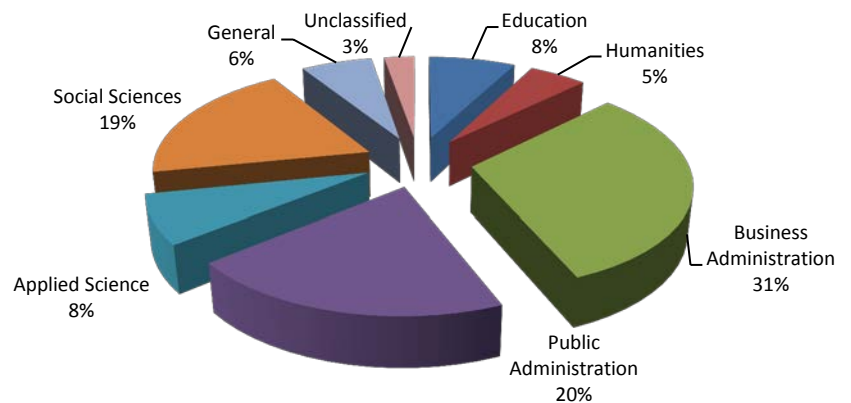

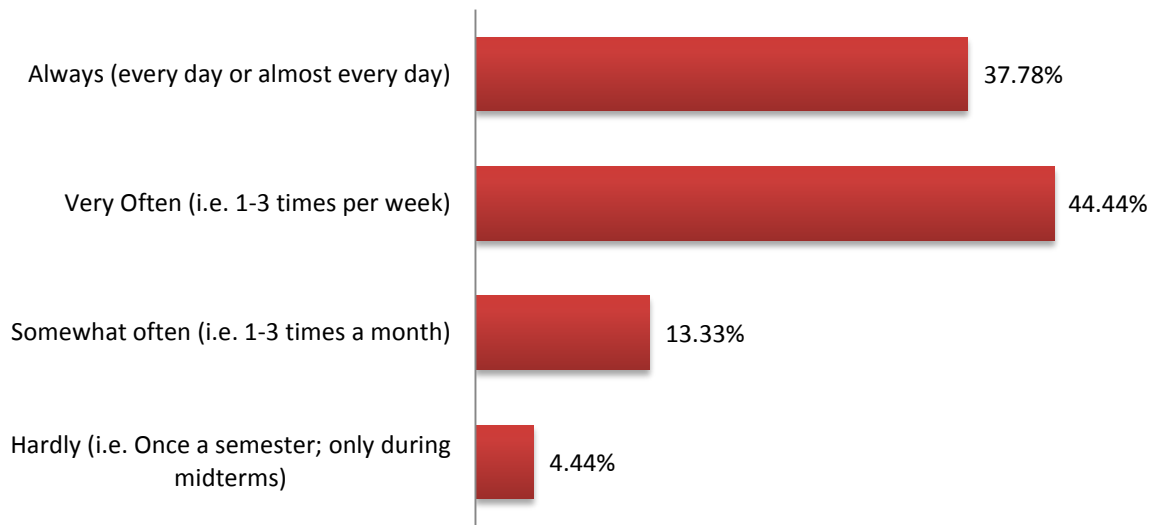

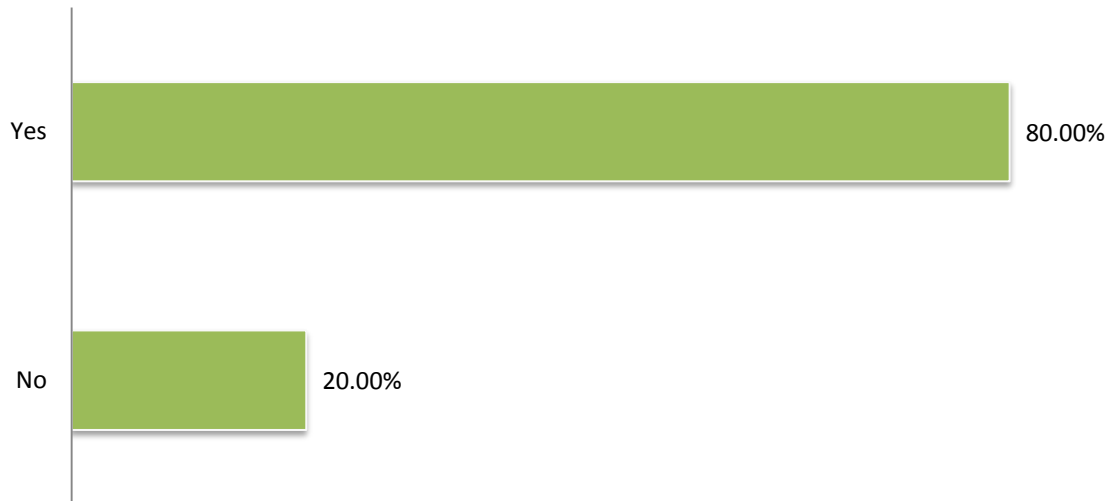

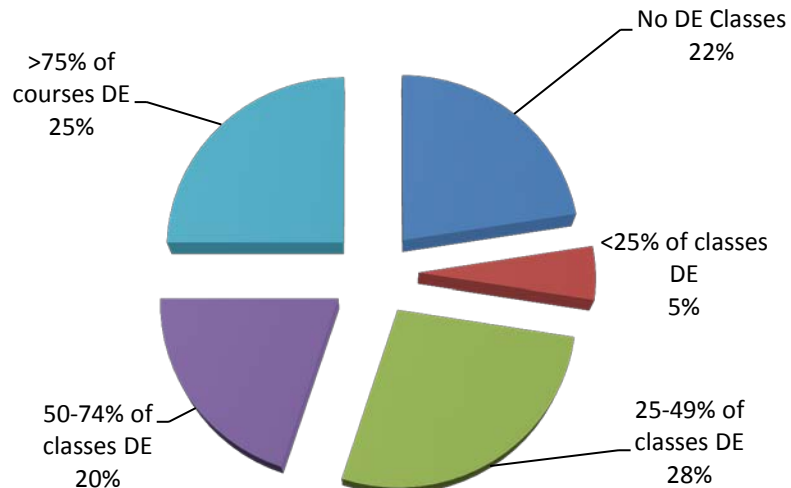
How often do you visit the library?



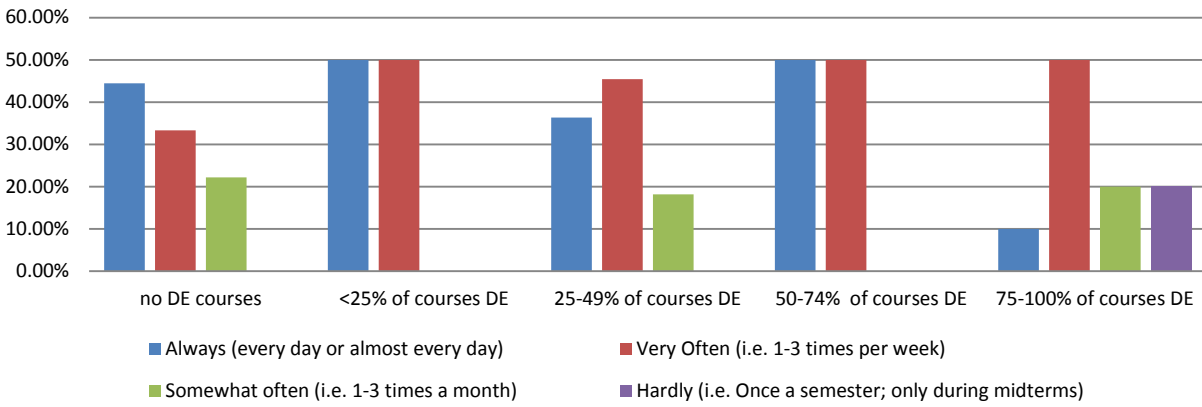
Are you taking or have you taken any online classes at UHWO?



% of Spring 2015 courses DE

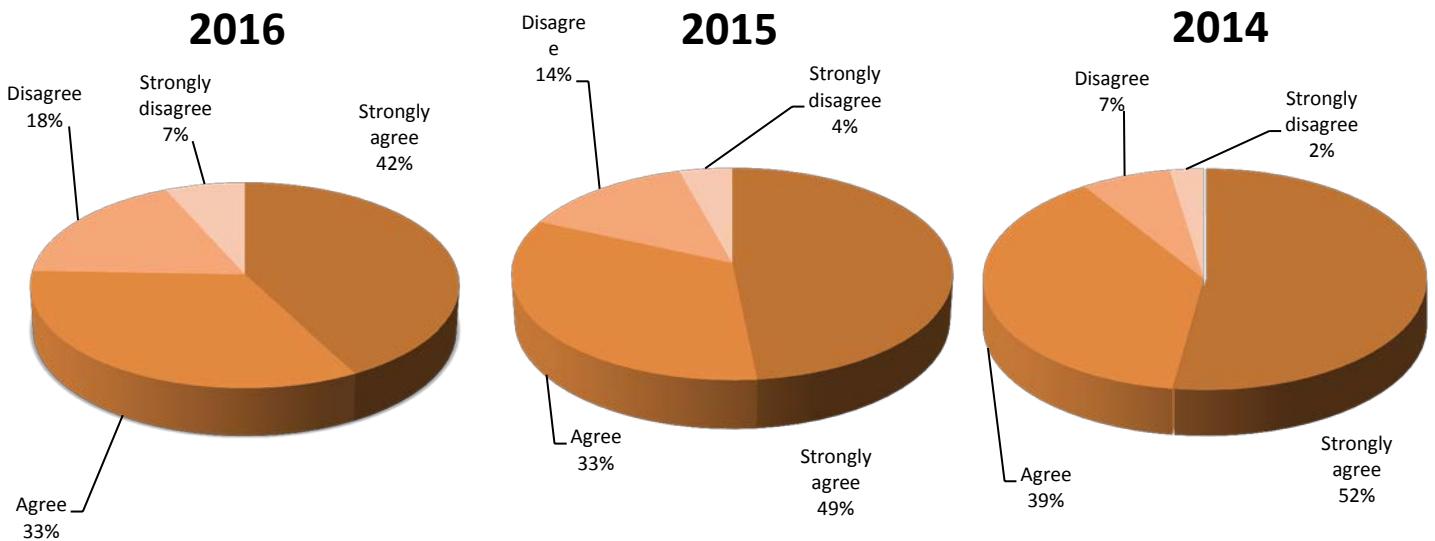


How often students visit the library, based on % of courses taken DE

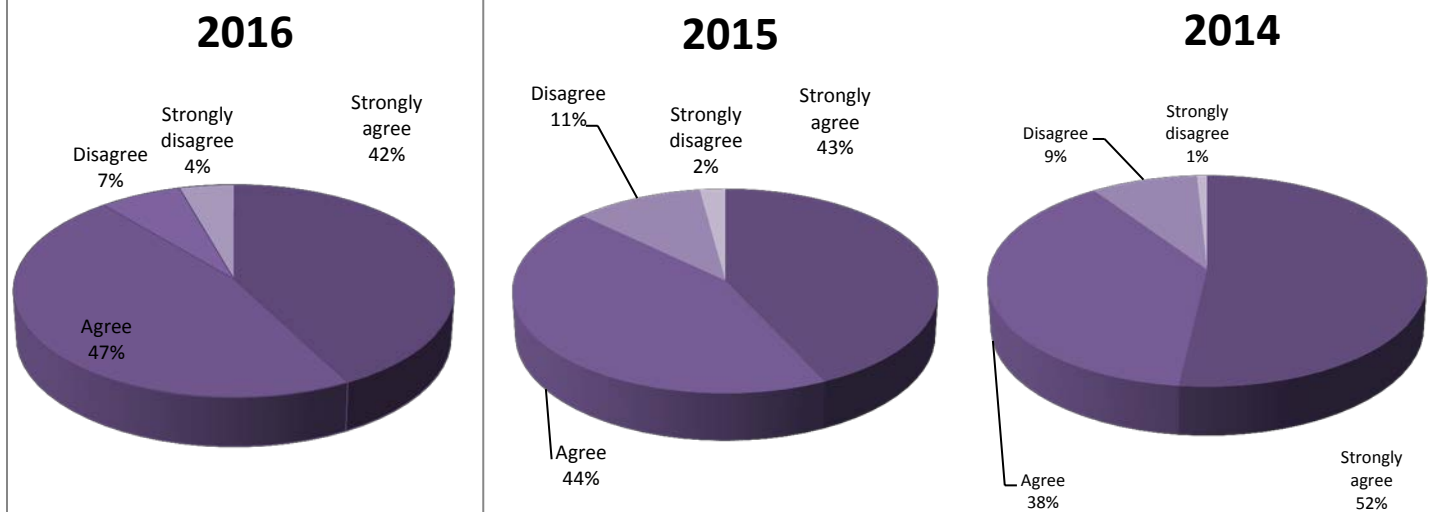

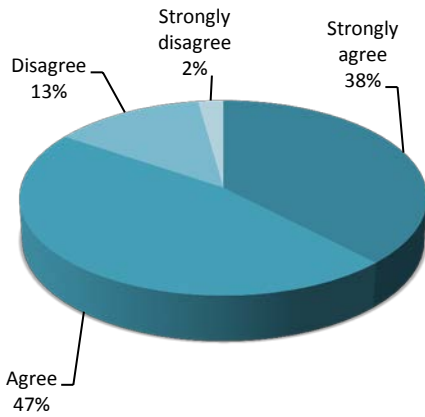

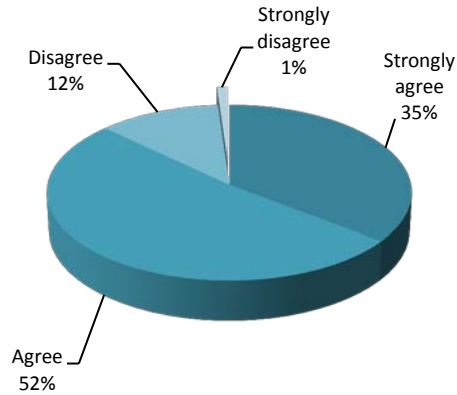

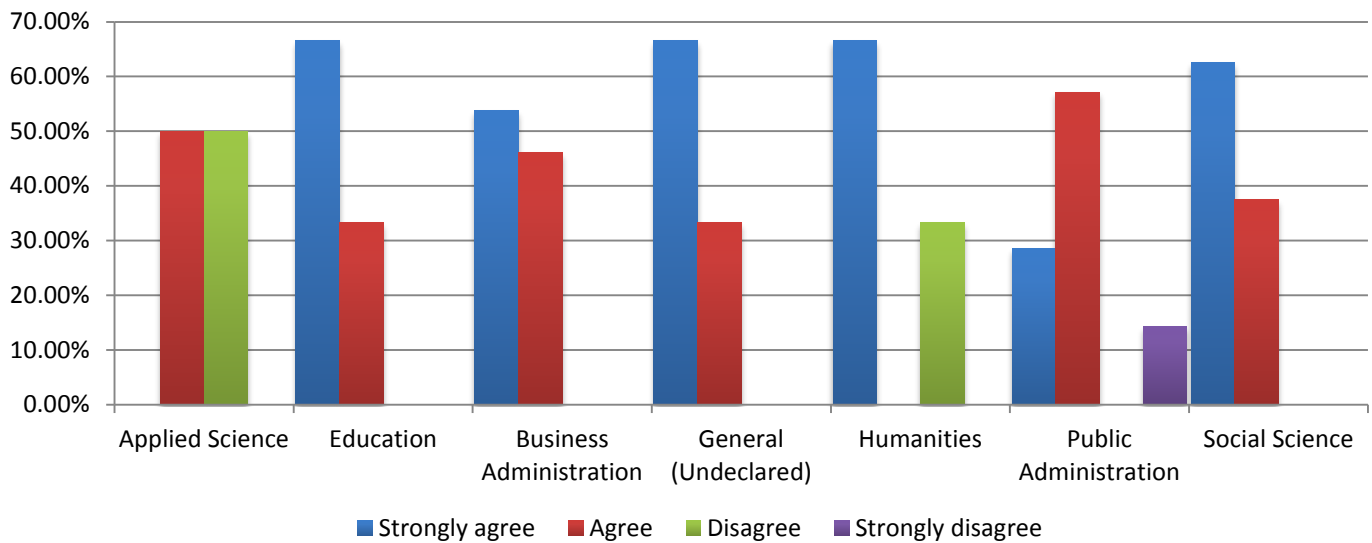
Satisfaction with print resources based on the Academic Concentration of Survey Respondents



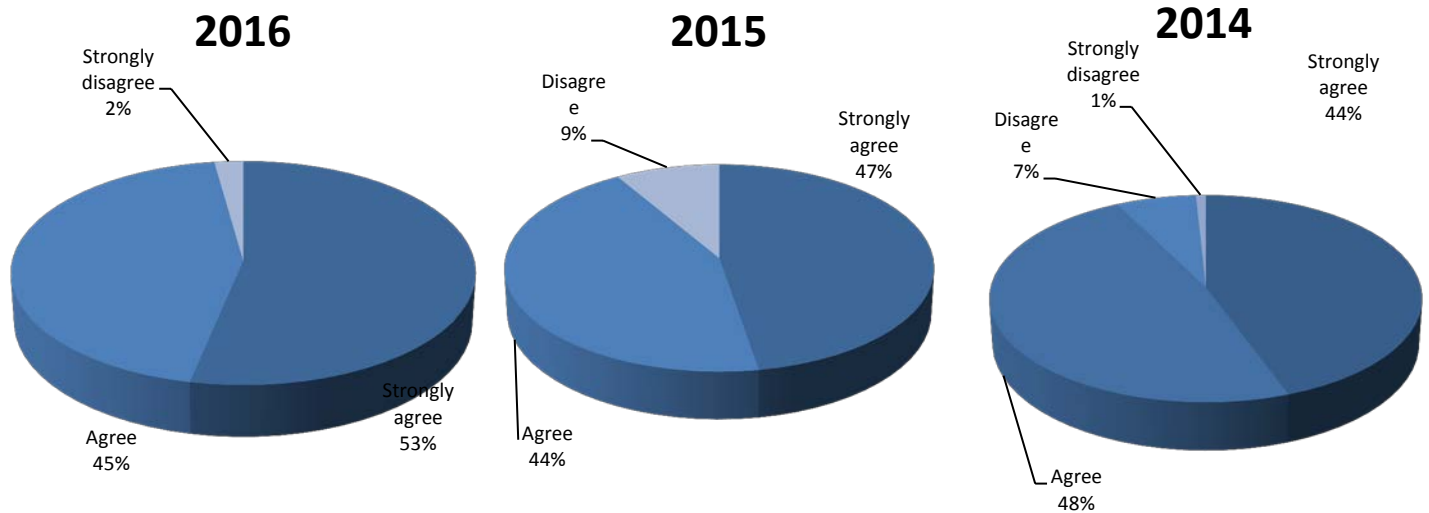
d. There are enough electronic articles in the library databases to help me complete my course assignments



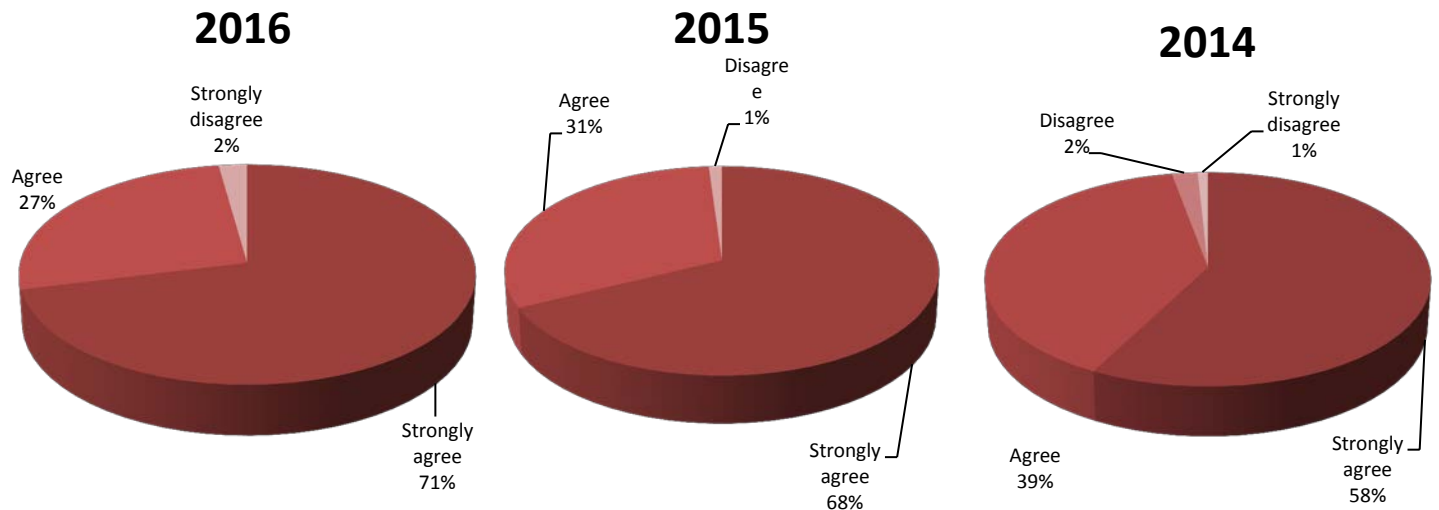
Satisfaction with electronic resources based on the Academic Concentration of Survey Respondents



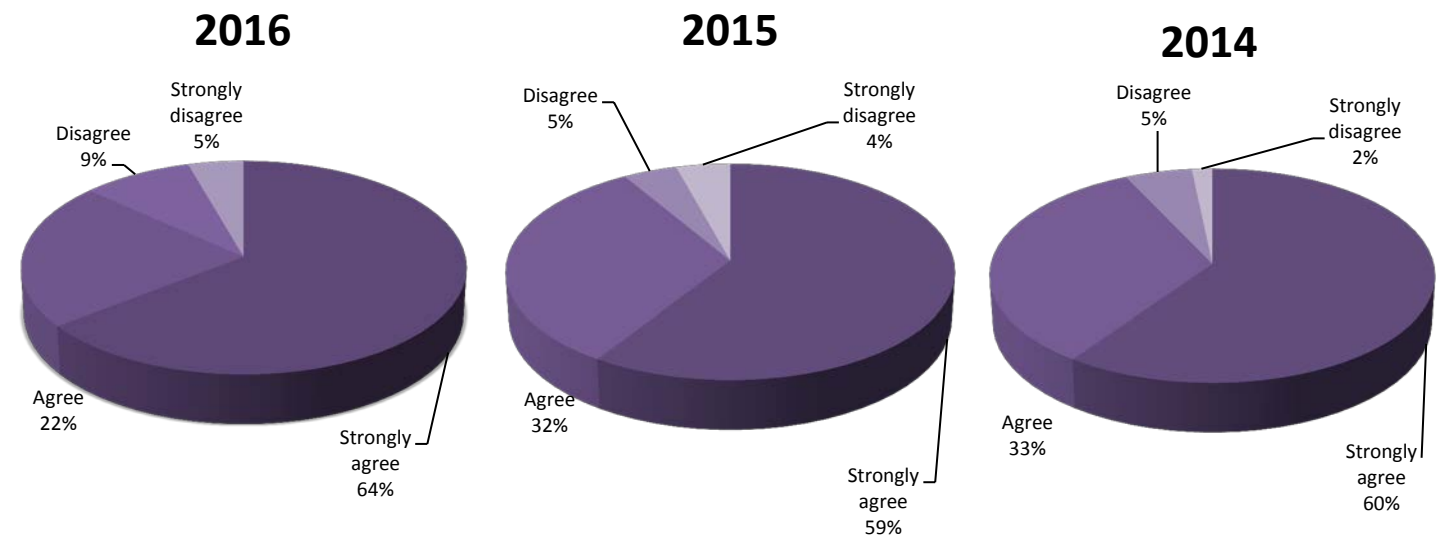
e. The library's web site directs me to the resources and services I need to complete my coursework.



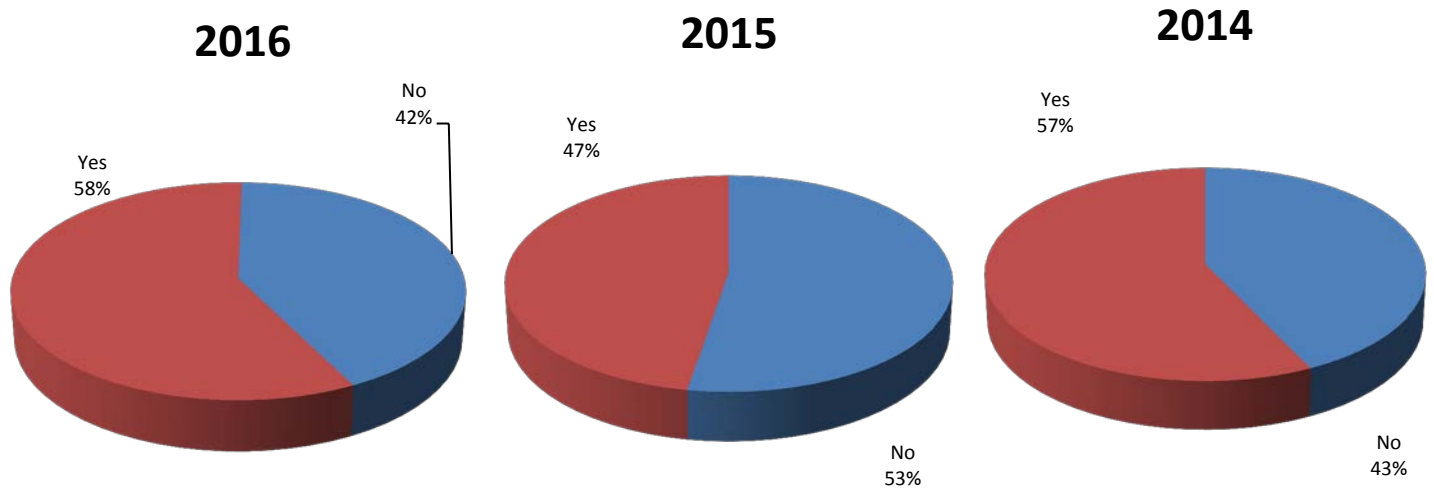
f. The librarians are helpful in guiding me to the resources I need for my courses



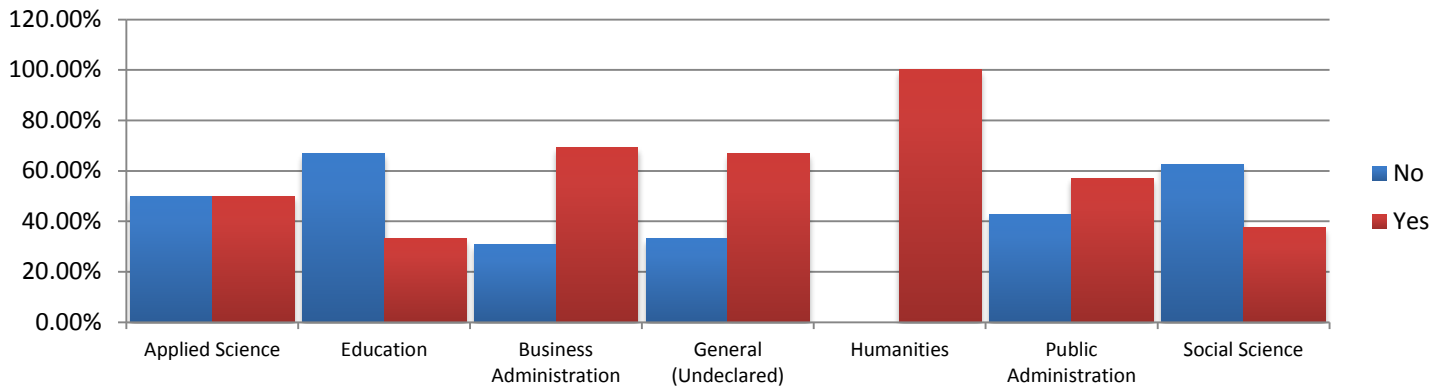

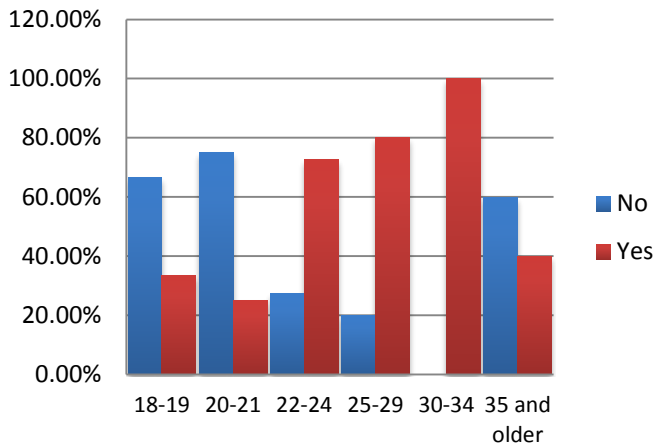

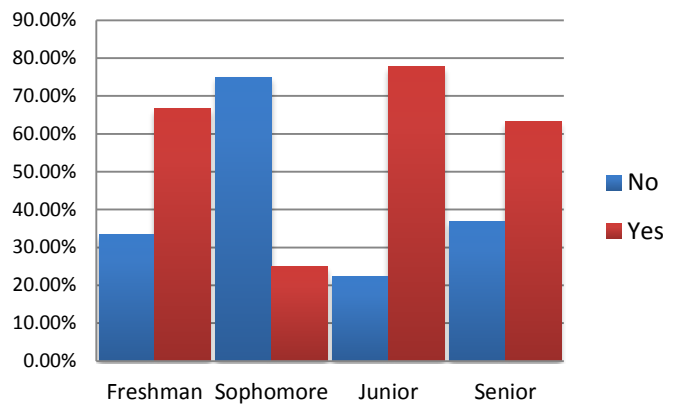
Ebook Use by Primary Academic Concentration



Ebook Use by Age



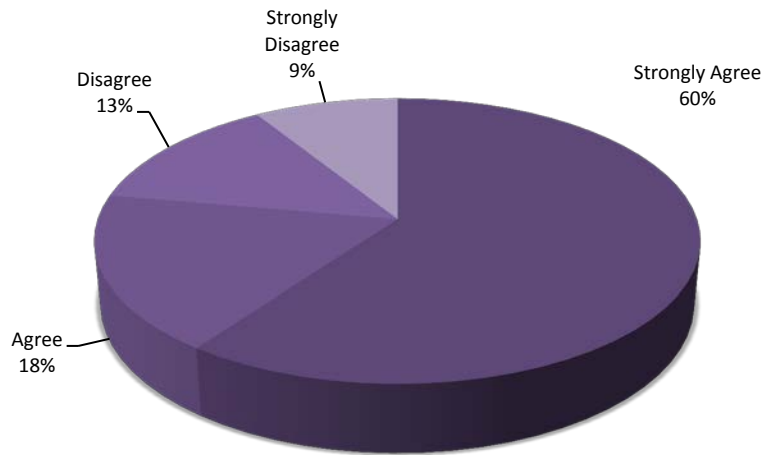

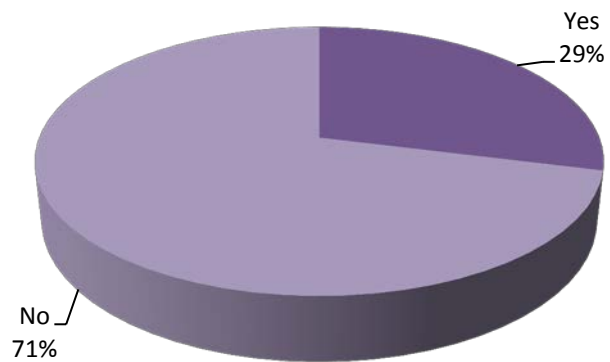

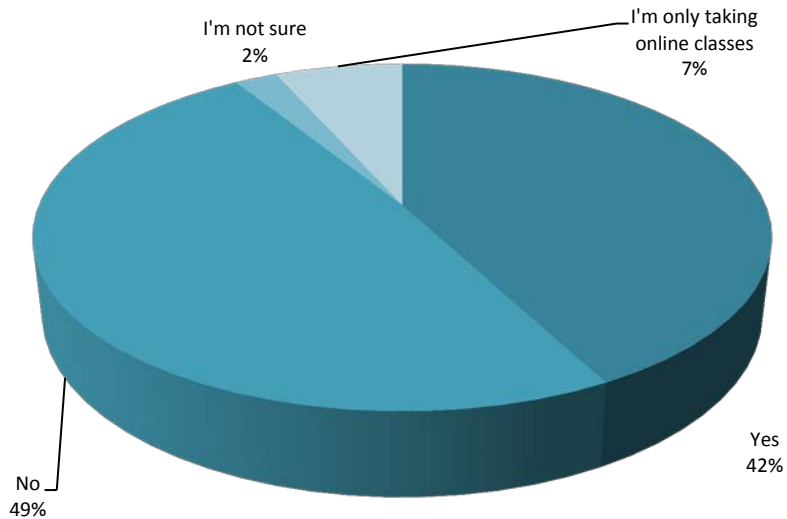
Do you agree/disagree with the following statement: "Textbook costs are an important factor in my course enrollment decisions"



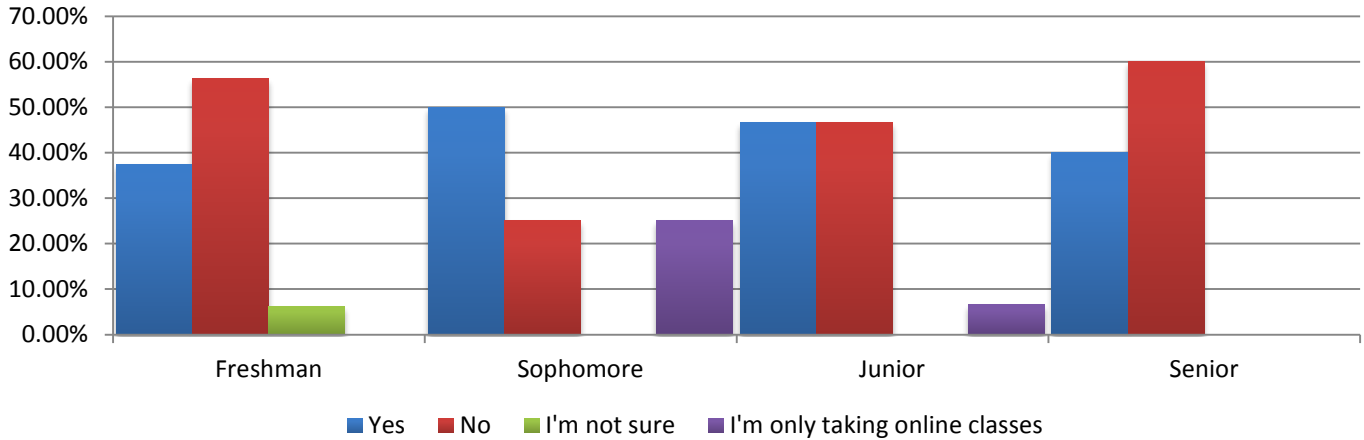

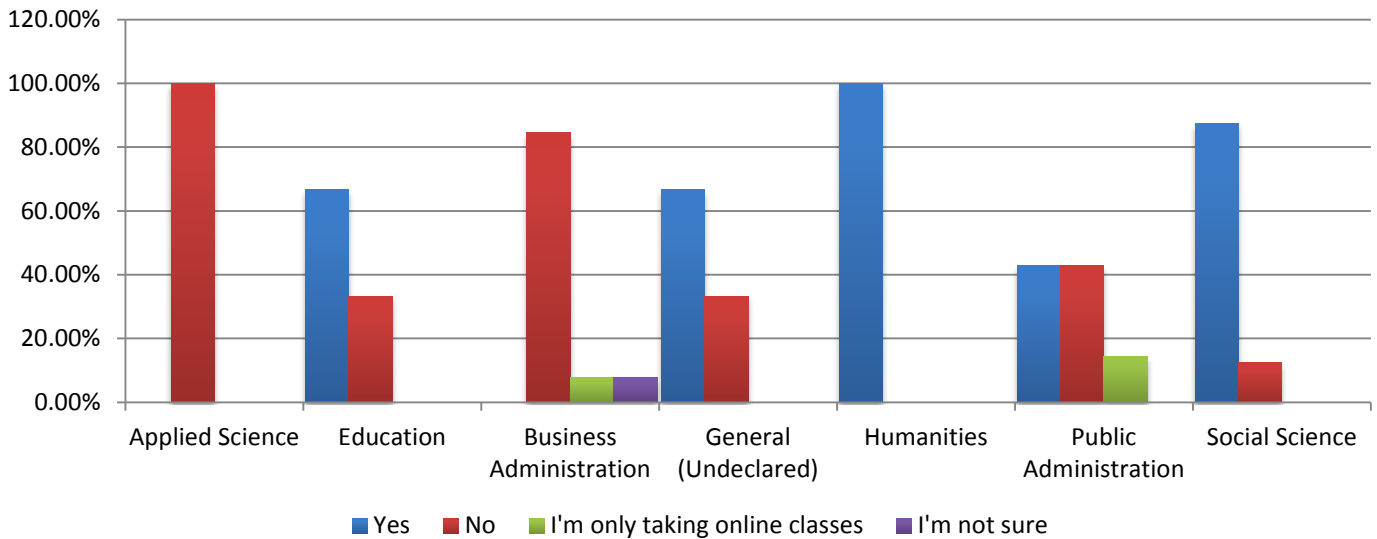
