



The Senator Daniel K. Inouye Collection

Collection Description

In 2013, the Senator Daniel K. Inouye Collection was given to the University of Hawai'i West O'ahu Library by Irene Hirano Inouye, wife of Senator Daniel K. Inouye. This collection consists of 610 books that were gifted to the Senator by authors, colleagues, friends, and world leaders. A large number of topics are covered in this collection including international and domestic politics, healthcare, World War II history, Native American rights, and religion. The Inouye Collection also contains many books on Hawaiian history that range from pre-contact to the present day.

User Agreement

These guidelines were developed to preserve and protect the collection while continuing to provide access to the materials. This User Agreement should be signed before items are requested from the collection. Please remember, *no kākou ke kuleana*, it's our responsibility to ensure these items are available in the future.

- The books in this collection are to be used at the Reference Desk. These materials may not circulate or leave the designated area.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed while using items in this collection. Covered drinks should be kept away from material.
- Multiple items can be requested but only one item can be used at a time.
- Use pencil to take notes. No pens, markers, or highlighters are allowed around material.
- Do not fold or mark pages in a book. Use a sheet of paper to save your place.
- Fragile books should be handled with care. In special cases, photocopies of the material may be supplied in lieu of originals.
- Loose items need to be kept with the book.

We highly encourage researchers to use their digital cameras without flash to make duplicates.
