






LOANABLE DEVICES






COURSE RESERVES

DATABASES

- Access ebooks, peer-reviewed articles, and more (<u>start browsing</u>)
- Each database has its own filter options
 - Publication Date
 - Resource Type
 - Peer-Reviewed
 - Full-text Only
- Each database has its own tools
 - Citation Generator
 - Email to Self
 - Save Permalink





RESEARCH GUIDES (LIBGUIDES)

- Research Guides: subject, course, or topic
- Currently = 60+ guides
- Great starting point for your research needs and pointing you to relevant resources


THE SIFT METHOD



S)TOP

- I NVESTIGATE (THE SOURCE)
- FIND (TRUSTED COVERAGE)
- T)RACE (TO THE ORIGINAL)







STOP



- Do you know the website? Do you trust it? If not, figure out what you're looking at.

 - NEVER share information until you know what it is, and have complete trust in its accuracy.









- You should know WHAT you are reading BEFORE you read it.
 - What is the expertise and agenda of the
 - CHECK: Wikipedia, fact-checking sites, or what other sites say about this source.









- To verify if a claim is factual, look for other trusted reporting on it.
 - Look for more trusted, in-depth, or varied coverage.









- Much of what we see has been stripped of context.
 - What was left out of a story/photo/video? What happened before?
 - o If a news story mentions a research study, find the study, and evaluate whether the news report was accurate?
 - Go back to the ORIGINAL source to understand the full story.

Undervalued:(


Facts that confirm our beliefs are <u>OVERVALUED</u>.




