**PROFESSIONAL TEACHER EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS: 30 credits****Admission Requirements - Approval of Application for Professional Teacher Education (APTE):**

1. Submit an Application for Teacher Education (APTE) to the Division of Education by the 1<sup>st</sup> week of the semester preceding anticipated enrollment.
2. Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators ("Core"): Passing Scores: Reading (156), Math (150), Writing (162); OR SAT taken prior to 03/2016: SAT Reading (530), SAT Math (560) and Praxis Core Writing (162); OR SAT taken 03/2016 or later: Evidence Based Reading and Writing (540), Writing (520), Math (580); OR ACT Reading (18), ACT Math (19), and Praxis Core Writing (162)
3. Completion of a minimum of 55 credits.
4. "C-" or higher in EDEF 200, EDEF 201, EDEF 310, and SPED 304. "C-" or higher in ENG 100, ENG 200, MATH 111, PSY 340 (or PSY 240 or FAMR 230), and PSY 342.
5. 2.5 Overall GPA; This includes GPA for credits transferred to UHWO.
6. Fingerprinting and criminal background check clearance by the Hawai'i Department of Education.

**THE PROFESSIONAL SEMESTER: 15 credits****Student Teaching Application Requirements:** (submit 8 mos. prior to enrollment in student teaching)

1. Completion of all required Pre-professional & Professional and Professional Teacher Education courses.
2. 2.75 GPA or higher for the Methods Block courses (400-level series);
3. 2.5 overall or higher GPA, with no grade lower than a "C-" for all Education courses.
4. Content knowledge verification, must complete one of the options below:
  - Passing of Praxis II Content Knowledge Test. HTSB website <http://www.ets.org/praxis/hi/requirements>. **OR**
  - Complete a total of 36 credits, including 9 credits in each of the 4 content areas, with a 2.50+ GPA: Language Arts, Mathematics, Science & Social Studies. At least 3 credits in each of the 4 content areas must be upper division.
