Dual Degree: The Division of Education currently offers a dual degree in Middle-Level or Secondary English Education and English. Upon successful completion of the B. Ed in English Education, 6-8 or 6-12, the student will also be awarded the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Humanities with a concentration in English.

Double counted courses do not reduce the number of credits required for the concentration. Students are still responsible for meeting the minimum number of credits in the concentration and the overall total credits for graduation*

1. Submit an Application for Teacher Education (APTE) to the Division of Education by the 1<sup>st</sup> week of the semester preceding anticipated enrollment.
2. Completion of a minimum of 55 credits.
3. "C-" or higher in EDEF 200, EDEF 201, EDEF 310, EDEF 345, ENG 100, ENG 200, MATH 100, PSY 342, PSY 343 and SPED 304.
4. 2.5 Overall GPA; this includes GPA for credits transferred to UHWO.
5. Fingerprinting and criminal background check clearance by the Hawai'i Department of Education.

**PROFESSIONAL STUDENT TEACHING SEMESTER: 15 credits****Student Teaching Application Requirements:** (submit 8 mos. prior to enrollment in student teaching)

1. Completion of all required Pre-professional & Professional and Professional Teacher Education courses.
2. 2.75 GPA or higher for the Methods Block courses (400-level series).
3. 2.5 overall or higher GPA, with no grade lower than a "C-" for all Education courses.
4. Content knowledge verification, must complete one of the options below:
  - Passing of Praxis II Content Knowledge Test. HTSB website <http://www.ets.org/praxis/hi/requirements>. **OR**
  - Content major consisting of a minimum of 30 credits in the content field of the Bachelor's degree awarded by a regionally accredited institution of higher education **OR**
  - Complete a minimum of 30 credits in the content field from a regionally accredited institution of higher education with a 2.50+ GPA. At least 15 credits must be Upper Division.
