# UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I ARTICULATION AGREEMENT Leeward Community College Associate in Science degree in Teaching to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu Bachelor of Education with a concentration in Elementary Education, Middle-Level Education or Secondary Education

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate a smooth transition for students from the Leeward Community College Associate in Science in Teaching (AST) program to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) with a concentration in Elementary Education (K-6), Middle-Level Education (6-8) or Secondary Education (6-12) program. This recommended pathway is designed to produce multiple entry and exit points to flexibly serve student career and educational objectives. Students may use dual enrollment as a method of completing the required coursework outlined in the attachments to this agreement, contingent upon eligibility, deadlines, and established procedures.

Students must graduate from Leeward Community College with the articulated AS degree in Teaching to be eligible for the benefits of this Agreement. Completion of the articulated AST degree will enable students to follow the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu core, concentration, general education, focus, and graduation requirements in place on the effective term of this agreement. Participation in the University of Hawai'i Automatic Admissions transfer process is possible for students planning to complete the AS in Teaching provided that eligibility, deadlines and procedures established for the designated term of entry are met. Students who do not complete the AS in Teaching degree at Leeward Community College will be required to meet catalog requirements in place upon admission to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu. While this academic pathway represents the most efficient coursework progression from the AST program at Leeward Community College through the B.Ed program at the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu, individual course substitutions may be made on a case-by-case basis when recommended courses are not available; however, all core, concentration, general education, focus, and graduation requirements must still be met in those individual cases.

Upon admissions to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu, teacher candidates may declare elementary, middle-level or secondary education as their area of concentration

and begin pre-professional education coursework. Criteria for the final acceptance into the professional teacher education sequence of 400-level courses is as follows:

1. Submit an Application for Teacher Education (APTE) to the Division of Education by the 1st week of the semester preceding anticipated enrollment.

2. Completion of a minimum of 55 credits.

3. All Concentrations: Completion of EDEF 200, EDEF 201, EDEF 310, ENG 100, ENG 200, PSY 342, and SPED 304 with a grade of C- or better.

- All Elementary: Completion of PSY 340 (or PSY 240 or HDFS 230) with a grade of C- or better.
- All Middle-Level and Secondary: Completion of EDEF 345 and PSY 343 with a grade of C- or better.
- Math Requirement:
  - Elementary: MATH 111 with a grade of C- or better
  - Middle-Level and Secondary English and Social Studies: MATH 100 or higher with a grade of C- or better.
  - Middle-Level Math: MATH 112 with a grade of C- or better.
  - Secondary Math: MATH 241or higher with a grade of C- or better.
  - Middle-Level/Secondary General Science and Secondary Biology: MATH 103 of higher with a grade of C- or better.

4. 2.5 Overall GPA, including all college credits transferred to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu.

5. Fingerprinting and criminal background check clearance by the Hawai`i Department of Education.

To ensure efficient time to graduation, Leeward Community College AST candidates intending to transfer to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu are strongly encouraged to do the following:

<u>NOTE:</u> Middle-level and secondary education candidates should complete required content courses deemed equivalent by the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu. (See UHWO College Success Advisors for information on required courses that simultaneously meet General Education requirements).

Teacher Candidates must ultimately meet all UHWO graduation and focus requirements, including Hawaiian Asian Pacific (HAP), Oral Communication (OC), Contemporary Ethical Issues (ETH) and 3 Upper Division Writing Intensive (WI) courses.

Under the terms of this Agreement, the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu agrees to:

- 1. Identify Success Advisors at the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu who will partner with Leeward Community College Counselors to ensure timely and accurate advising information on pre-admission, admission, degree requirements, and other related advising information.
- 2. Identify a Success Advisor at the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu who will work with their campus STAR personnel to develop an accurate STAR pathway for students pursuing this articulation agreement.
- 3. Identify a University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu faculty member who will serve as the faculty advisor to students who are part of this articulation in the selected concentration.
- 4. Inform students that financial aid may be available through either institution as the student identifies his/her home campus each semester, and that students must follow the financial aid policies and procedures at that home school in order to be eligible for financial aid.

5. Meet with Leeward Community College faculty and/or administration minimally every three years, or on an as-needed basis, to discuss potential and planned curricular changes.

Under the terms of this Agreement, Leeward Community College agrees to:

- 1. Place a notation in the advisor notes in STAR which identifies AS in Teaching students intending to transfer to the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu who are in the process of completing the AS degree and are a part of this articulation.
- 2. Identify a Counselor at Leeward Community College who will partner with the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu advisors to ensure timely and accurate advising information on pre-admission, admission, degree requirements, and other relevant advising information.
- 3. Identify a Leeward Community College faculty member who will serve as the faculty advisor to students who are part of the articulation.
- 4. Inform students that financial aid may be available through either institution as the student identifies his/her home campus each semester, and that students must follow the financial aid policies and procedures at that home school in order to be eligible for financial aid.
- 5. Meet with the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu faculty and/or administration minimally every three years, or on an as needed basis, to discuss potential and planned curricular changes.

This Articulation Agreement is effective beginning Fall 2021 and is based on the General Education and Focus requirements in effect at the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu for 2021-2022.

This Agreement will be subject to review in academic year 2024 and may be continued, revised or discontinued with the consent of both parties. Should both parties agree to terminate the Agreement, the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu will honor the Agreement stipulations for identified students currently enrolled in this articulation option at the time of termination.

Requirements of the articulated Associate in Science in Teaching and the Bachelor of Education with a concentration in Elementary Education, Middle-level Education and Secondary Education are provided as attachments and form the basis of this Agreement. Subsequent changes to the curricular requirements of these programs may require revisions to this Agreement.

- 2. 2.75 GPA or higher for the Methods Block courses (400-level series).
- 3. 2.5 overall or higher GPA, with no grade lower than a "C-" for all Education courses.
- 4. Content knowledge verification, must complete one of the options below:
  - Passing of Praxis II Content Knowledge Test. HTSB website http://www.ets.org/praxis/hi/requirements.
     OR
  - Content major consisting of a minimum of 30 credits in the content field of the Bachelor's degree awarded by a regionally accredited institution of higher education OR
  - Complete a minimum of 30 credits in the content field from a regionally accredited institution of higher education with a 2.50+ GPA. At least 15 credits must be Upper Division.
