



#### UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu Pre-Nursing Pathway to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate a smooth transition for students from the University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu Pre-Nursing Pathway to the University of Hawai'i Mānoa Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

The Pre-Nursing Pathway aims to develop and prepare scholarly leaders from West Oʻahu who are interested in improving the health and wellness of their community through a career in nursing. Through a unique collaboration between the Math, Natural & Health Sciences Division (MNHS) of the University of Hawaiʻi-West Oʻahu (UH West Oʻahu) and the Nancy Atmospera-Walch School of Nursing at the University of Hawaiʻi Mānoa (UH Mānoa), Pre-Nursing Pathway students will enroll in rigorous science courses and engage in hands-on clinical training opportunities in a variety of settings led by highly skilled professionals. This dynamic academic experience will be supplemented with state-of-the-art simulation equipment that provides extended learning options. The program fosters a holistic approach through incorporating Native Hawaiian values and principles, as well as place-based and 'āina-based learning.

The Pre-Nursing Pathway enables UH West Oʻahu students to complete all general education, prerequisite courses, and required courses within the Nursing bachelor's curriculum for a UH Mānoa Bachelor of Science in Nursing on the UH West Oʻahu's campus. Students will initially be admitted to the UH West Oʻahu as "Pre-Nursing Pathway" students in the Bachelor of Applied Science, Health Professions, General Health Sciences concentration and will enroll in and complete pre-nursing courses.

Students may apply to the Bachelor of Science (BS) in Nursing program offered by the UH Mānoa Nancy Atmospera-Walch School of Nursing (NAWSON) after successful completion of the Pre-Nursing Pathway courses. Through this specialized partnership, both campuses will provide students with support services and opportunities needed to prepare for admission into the nursing program. Students admitted to the BS in Nursing Cohort will change their home school from UH West Oʻahu to UH Mānoa in semester 4.

The purpose of the extra semester is to provide support and preparation for these students to ensure their success in the pre-nursing pathway and the BS in Nursing program. This mitigation is similar to the Imi Hoʻola program with the John A. Burns School of Medicine. Additionally, UH West Oʻahu is a premier, comprehensive, Indigenous-serving institution and the planned 4.5-year program will allow UHWO students an additional semester of preparation during their pre-nursing pathway to become immersed in a Hawaiian place of learning with additional support to be successful in the rigorous nursing program.

To continue to offer a quality nursing program and decrease negative impacts of increased enrollment, we plan to do a Spring admission to the UH Mānoa's NAWSON program (there is currently only a Fall admission). This Spring admission will help to increase UH Mānoa's capacity to educate nurses for Hawai'i, but it will allow us to do so in this climate of nursing faculty shortages and limited clinical site capacity.

Admissions Criteria, pre-requisites and program requirements for the Pre-Nursing Pathway and the BS in Nursing are provided in Appendix I and II and form the basis of this Agreement. Subsequent changes to the curricular requirements of the program may require revisions to this Agreement.

Under the terms of this Agreement, the UH West O'ahu agrees to:

- 1. Offer all current general education and pre-requisite requirements for the UH Mānoa BS in Nursing program as outlined in the Appendix I.
- Develop, enhance and offer Student Development and Health Science Seminar courses to support students accepted into the Pre-Nursing Pathway. The courses will include community engagement activities, academic support opportunities and social networking experiences.
- 3. Form a UH West O'ahu admissions and selection committee responsible for the intake and initial review of applications for the Pre-Nursing Pathway.
- 4. UH West O'ahu eligible students must apply using the UH NAWSON two-step application process. UH West O'ahu will forward recommended students of the Pre-Nursing Pathway cohort to UH Mānoa NAWSON for review. Admission will not be deferred.
- 5. Provide adequate space and technology for, and coordinate availability of, appropriate classroom instructional facilities for the UH Mānoa faculty to offer courses at the UH West Oʻahu campus during the transition semester and all subsequent semesters of the UH Mānoa BS in Nursing program coursework.
- 6. Facilitate relationships for clinical placement opportunities with neighboring UH West Oʻahu health facilities (i.e., health centers and clinics).

- 7. Identify a Success Advisor at the UH West Oʻahu who will partner with the UH Mānoa NAWSON Undergraduate Program Advisor to ensure timely and accurate advising information on pre-admission, admission, degree requirements, and other related advising information. The Success Advisor at the UH West Oʻahu will work with UH Mānoa's campus STAR personnel to develop an accurate STAR pathway for students pursuing this articulation agreement.
- 8. Identify a UH West Oʻahu faculty member who will serve as the Faculty Coordinator of the Pre-Nursing Pathway. The West Oʻahu Faculty Coordinator will also serve as a mentor to students of the accepted cohort. The UH West Oʻahu Faculty Coordinator will work closely with the UH Mānoa NAWSON Undergraduate Program Director.
- 9. Identify a UH West O'ahu staff member who will serve as the Program Coordinator of the Pre-Nursing Pathway.
- 10. Identify UH West Oʻahu instructor(s) who will provide additional instructional and teaching support for the pre-nursing curriculum. Faculty that instruct the courses designated as lower division writing intensive courses as outlined in this agreement will complete UH West Oʻahu Writing Intensive training and be approved by the Writing Intensive Committee
- 11. Inform students that financial aid may be available through either institution as the student identifies his/her home campus each semester, and that students must follow the financial aid policies and procedures at that home school to be eligible for financial aid.
- 12. Meet with the UH Mānoa NAWSON faculty and/or administration annually and on an as-needed basis, to discuss program quality improvement and potential curricular changes.
- 13. Upgrade the UH West Oʻahu simulation facility to include but not limited to audio/visual, information technology, and high fidelity mannikins. Use of the simulation space will be prioritized for the BS in Nursing cohort. The UH West Oʻahu simulation Lab Coordinator will work with the UH Mānoa THSSC Lab Coordinator to schedule high fidelity simulation coverage by THSSC Staff.
- 14. Arrange UH Mānoa Campus visits at least annually for each cohort to attend required simulation activities at UH Mānoa.
- 15. Offer the following University of Hawai'i-UH West O'ahu courses to fulfill the UH Mānoa BS in Nursing requirements:
  - a. PSY 240 with a DS designation as an equivalent to UH Mānoa's HDFS
     230 and to fulfill the DS General Education requirement

- b. ENG 220 as a lower division Writing Intensive (it will be taught in accordance with UH Mānoa's WI requirements)
- c. PHYL 142L as a lower division Writing Intensive (it will be taught in accordance with UH Mānoa's WI requirements)
- 16. Collaborate with UH Mānoa 'IKE AO PONO program to increase the number of Native nurses in order to advance the healthcare and well-being of Native islanders and all peoples throughout Hawai'i nei.
- 17. In anticipation of the need for additional funding and faculty and staff positions, UH West Oʻahu MNHS and UH Mānoa NAWSON will work together to generate a budget and strategic fund development plan, which may include (but not exclusively) grants, philanthropic resources, and legislative requests.

Under the terms of this Agreement, the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa NAWSON agrees to:

- 1. Review applications and accept a cohort of UH West Oʻahu Students into the BS in Nursing program each spring. Students must meet the UH Mānoa and NAWSON BS in Nursing admission requirements as outlined in Appendix II. If there are less than 24 Pre-Nursing students from UH West Oʻahu that meet NAWSON admission criteria, the unfilled seats will be offered first to UH West Oʻahu students that meet the criteria, and thereafter UH Mānoa BS in Nursing applicants with a priority to those that reside in Leeward Oʻahu. UH West Oʻahu students not admitted into the BS Nursing program or who are ineligible and must repeat a course(s) may be eligible to apply with a subsequent cohort. The first cohort will enter in Spring 2024.
- 2. Offer UH Mānoa Nursing courses at the UH West Oʻahuʻs campus during the transition semester and all subsequent semesters for the students accepted into the UH Mānoa BS in Nursing program. The BS in Nursing courses will be offered to students at the UH Mānoa undergraduate tuition rate and professional nursing fee in accordance with the UH approved tuition schedule.
- 3. The Undergraduate Program Advisor will partner with the UH West O'ahu College Success Advisor to ensure timely and accurate advising information on pre-admission, admission, degree requirements, and other relevant advising information. UH West O'ahu's seminar courses and UH Mānoa NAWSON's 'IKE AO PONO program provide additional support to admitted Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander students.
- 4. The Undergraduate Program Director will work closely with the UH West O'ahu Faculty Coordinator.
- 5. Will be responsible for clinical placements for the BS in Nursing Cohort via the Director for Clinical Placement and Operations.

- 6. Inform students that financial aid may be available through either institution as the student identifies his/her home campus each semester, and that students must follow the financial aid policies and procedures at that home school to be eligible for financial aid.
- 7. Will meet with the UH West Oʻahu faculty and/or administration annually and on an as-needed basis, to discuss program quality improvement and potential curricular changes.
- 8. Accept the following UH West O'ahu courses to fulfill the UH Mānoa BS in Nursing requirements:
  - a. Accept PSY 240 with a DS designation as an equivalent to UH Mānoa's HDFS 230 and to fulfill the DS General Education requirement
  - b. Accept ENG 220 as a lower division Writing Intensive (it will be taught in accordance with UH Mānoa's WI requirements)
  - c. Accept PHYL 142L as a lower division Writing Intensive (it will be taught in accordance with UH Mānoa's WI requirements)
- 9. Consult with UH West Oʻahu for simulation facility upgrades to include but not limited to audio/visual, information technology, and high fidelity mannikins. The UH Mānoa THSSC Lab Coordinator will work with the UH West Oʻahu Lab Coordinator to schedule high fidelity simulation coverage by THSSC Staff at the UH West Oʻahu Simulation Facility.
- 10. Offer required simulation activities at least annually for each cohort at the UH Mānoa campus.
- 11. In anticipation of the need for additional funding and faculty and staff positions, UH West Oʻahu MNHS and UH Mānoa NAWSON will work together to generate a budget and strategic fund development plan, which may include (but not exclusively) grants, philanthropic resources, and legislative requests.

This Agreement was electronically signed via Kuali on October 18, 2022 and is effective for five years from the time of signing. The Parties to this Agreement will review the program one year prior to the expiration of the agreement to ascertain whether alterations are required. Amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and approved by the chief academic officers of each campus. Changes made without agreement among the involved campuses may invalidate this Agreement. Any party may terminate its participation in this agreement by giving written notice to the designated representatives a minimum of one (I) year prior to the intended date of termination. All students in the program will be allowed to complete their course of study in accordance with the Agreement. The terms of this Agreement are subject to prevailing University of Hawai'i policies.

## University of Hawai'i-West O'ahu

The Pre-Nursing Pathway is designed to assist students seeking to prepare for admission and meet graduation requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree program offered by UH Mānoa. The coursework indicated below reflects the most efficient academic pathway. Please note that although course titles and numbers listed reflect UH West Oʻahu coursework, the requirements indicated are in alignment with the academic program requirements of the UH Mānoa campus, which can be found in the UH Mānoa General Catalog.

## **UH West O'ahu Pre-Nursing Pathway Admissions Requirements**

- High school GPA: 2.7 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale)
- Submission of a completed UH West O'ahu application by the deadline
- Freshman/First year student status or newly enrolled at UH West O'ahu
- Submission of Intent to Enroll in the Pre-Nursing Pathway form
- Attendance at a Pre-Nursing Pathway Informational Session
- Register for the required prerequisite coursework at UH West O'ahu each semester, according to the BAS-Health Professions, GHS, Pre-nursing Pathway Academic Map

# **UH West O'ahu Pre-Nursing Pathway Continued Enrollment Requirements**

- Submit a UH West Oʻahu & UH Mānoa Pre-Nursing Pathway Continued Enrollment Review Form by October 1st, requesting continued enrollment in the BAS-Health Professions, GHS, Pre-nursing Pathway
- Meet with a College Success Advisor and Faculty Advisor/Program Coordinator each semester
- Register for the required prerequisite coursework at UH West O'ahu each semester, according to the BAS-Health Professions, GHS, Pre-nursing Pathway Academic Map
- Maintain a minimum grade of "B" or higher (not B-) in PHYL lectures, PHYL labs,
   MICR 130, and MATH courses
- Maintain a minimum grade of "C" or higher (not C-) in all other prerequisite courses
- Participate in clinical, hands-on opportunities and simulation activities
- Complete and submit a Bachelor of Applied Science-Health Professions, General Health Science Pre-Nursing Pathway Continued Enrollment Verification Form

Selection Criteria: The above information provides minimum criteria for admission and acceptance to UH West Oʻahu and UH Mānoa Partnership. Acceptance into UH Mānoa's Bachelor of Science in Nursing is highly competitive and has additional

selection criteria. Preference will be given to students who have participated in the Pre-Nursing Pathway and reside in Leeward O'ahu.

- Completion of at least 29 pre-requisite credits must be completed at the time of application, and must include two PHYL lectures and labs and FQ. MICR 130 can be completed after application submission but must be successfully completed with a grade of B or higher prior to enrollment.
- All PHYL, MICR and FQ courses must receive a B grade or higher
- Remaining pre-requisites must receive a C grade or higher
- Applicants must be currently enrolled in, or have successfully completed all remaining prerequisites by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the year the student begins the nursing program.
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS):
  - o Min. scores are as follows:

Overall: 78% Reading: 83.3% Mathematics: 86.7% Science: 66.7%

English & Language Usage: 80% Scores are valid for 3 years.
